





NECT 'adopted' circuits: selection criteria

NRC adopted 22 circuits across the country to demonstrate and pilot the coordination of initiatives using the following criteria:

- Functional circuits with most positions filled.
- Participation of circuits in DBE reading programmes (PSRIP).
- Capacity of teachers to implement reading programmes.
- Involvement of NGOs through the reading programmes.
- Circuit participation in LIS programmes.
- Committed SGB to mobilise the community.

In response to schools audit conducted in 2018, reading cards were developed and distributed to schools in Limpopo to encourage learners to take books home and get parents involved in reading to them






Circuit Activations: Advocacy



- Advocacy posters distributed to 22
 of the 263 target circuits
- Held meetings with 10 of 22 circuits
- Held meetings with provincial library coordinators of all 9 provinces.
- Advocacy sessions held with district and provincial senior managers in Limpopo, Mpumalanga and North West.
- Held one advocacy session with NAPTOSA.














Book Drive


- The NRC collaborated with SADTU on International Women's Day by hosting a book drive in Free State, Limpopo, North West and the Eastern Cape.









NAPTOSA book club

- NAPTOSA committed to run book club sessions with principals and SMT members at least once a term












Presidential book club


